The Economic Development Partnership of Alabama (EDPA) recently awarded "Alabama AdvantageSite" designation to the Northeast College Site, a 100-acre industrial property located adjacent to Northeast Alabama Community College in Jackson County. The utility infrastructure is in DeKalb County, so the development of this site is a joint effort through Jackson/DeKalb Counties IDA. JCEDA was the lead on preparing all documentation necessary to earn the certification.

In 2008, Jackson County Industrial Park was the first site to be designated. The program has grown and is now well-known to companies and site consultants who often inquire specifically about AdvantageSites. The Northeast College Site was EDPA's 45th designation.

Cyber Symbiotics is a newly-formed coalition of communities in North Alabama united in a regional partnership for cyber security development projects. The partnership was formed to prepare for the estimated 53% increase in cyber security jobs over the next 5-10 years. The Cyber Symbiotics Regional Partnership includes the cities of Scottsboro, Arab, and Guntersville, as well as Jackson County EDA and Marshall County EDA.

While metro Huntsville is developing cyber-related infrastructure and leadership, many government and private projects have a need to be located close, but not too close, to larger installations. North Alabama offers a unique advantage and a variety of options for a national cyber security initiative. Northeast Alabama Community College is working to implement a cyber security technology training program, and Jackson County EDA earned TVA's "Primary Data Center Site" designation for industrial property adjacent to the college. An optimal combination of available resources including defense, intelligence, business, engineering, R&D, energy/telecom and education, plus the superb quality of life and natural beauty of North Alabama makes the area poised to become a viable option for cyber security companies looking for a prime location.

Dus Chairs TVA's RERC

Dus Rogers has been appointed as the first chairman of the recently-formed Regional Energy Resource Council for the Tennessee Valley Authority. The council, which will advise TVA on current and future energy activities, was established this year under the Federal Advisory Committee Act and modeled after the Regional Resource Stewardship Council, which has played an advisory role for TVA since 2000. Each of the 19 council members will serve without compensation for two years and the group will meet twice annually. The first meeting was held in Scottsboro on October 24.
